

SuperHalves- change from 5 to 6 races

Q&A

■ What is changing about the SuperHalves Series?

Before the change: The SuperHalves series in 2022 and 2023 consists of 5 races.

SH5 Series = Lisbon – Prague – Copenhagen – Cardiff – Valencia

If runners finish the races in 36 months (3 years), starting on the date of their first race completed, they receive the SuperMedal (with 5 cities) at the finish line of their fifth and final race.

The change: From 2024, the SuperHalves series consists of 6 races.

SH6 Series = Lisbon – Prague – Berlin - Copenhagen – Cardiff – Valencia

Runners have 60 months (5 years) to finish the series, starting from the date of their first race completed. They will receive a new SuperMedal (with 6 cities) at the end.

The extended series is now balanced with 3 spring and 3 autumn events and an extended time to complete all races makes planning and enjoying your SuperHalves adventure even easier.

Summary: the change means **1 more race** and **2 more years**.

■ What else is changing besides the number of races and the time?

Nothing else changes except the number of races (5 -> 6) and the time limit (36 -> 60), all other rules and principles remain the same.

The website will be updated at the end of 2023 to reflect the change, the SuperPassport will have one more page and we are working on a new six-race SuperMedal for 2024!

■ Does this change impact the races, rules, conditions, etc. in 2023?

No, it has no effect or impact on the 2023 races.

- **Do I need to do anything to join the SH6 series? Register/Accept/Opt-in?**

No, you don't need to do anything to be part of the SH6 Series. Your SuperHalves account and running profile will automatically change at the end of the year. And you will just continue on your way to an even more exciting journey (6 races – 60 months)!

- **I don't want to travel to the 6th city, I only plan to complete the existing 5 races. Can I finish the Superhalves under the SH5 Series rules?**

Yes, sure. Runners who started their journey in 2022 or 2023 can choose to remain on the existing 5 race journey. At the end of 2023, there will be an option on www.superhalves.com to opt out of the SH6 Series and finish your journey under SH5 rules (5 races – 36 months). If you choose to finish with the SH5 rules, these 5 races must be Lisbon, Prague, Copenhagen, Cardiff, and Valencia (Berlin cannot be one of the five cities).

- **Can I complete the SH5 series with Berlin as one of the 5 races?**

No, you can't. The SH5 Series consists of five "original" races before the change: Lisbon – Prague – Copenhagen – Cardiff – Valencia.

- **I am in the middle of my journey, having done 1 or 2 or 3 or 4 races in 2023. What should I do now? And do I get two SuperMedals when I finish the fifth race and then the sixth race?**

You don't have to do anything. At the end of 2023: your route will be changed from SH5 to SH6 series, your SuperHalves passport will get a new page for the Berlin stamp and you will continue to register and participate in races until your 6th race where you will receive your SuperMedal (with 6 cities).

No, you get one SuperMedal for one running journey.

- **I have already won my SuperMedal with five cities in 2022 or 2023 and that is the end of my SuperHalves journey. Can I continue and participate in SH6 Series, sign up for Berlin and get the SuperMedal with 6 cities? Or do I have to do the whole series again?**

Your SuperHalves account will be automatically unlocked and enabled to participate. And if you finish the Berlin race under the new condition (60 months from your first race), you will get the SuperMedal with 6 cities. In this very special case, you will own at the end two SuperMedals. So no, as our valuable 2022 or 2023 SuperRunner, you don't have to repeat the entire series.

- I am still lost on how to calculate the time window to finish the journey. Can you give me an example?

Yes. We will give you an example for the SH5 Series and SH6 Series.

SH5 Series = Lisbon – Prague – Copenhagen – Cardiff – Valencia

SH6 Series = Lisbon – Prague – Berlin - Copenhagen – Cardiff – Valencia

Let's say you started in Copenhagen in 2022. **Under SH5 conditions**, you have to finish in 36 months, which means before Copenhagen 2025 = Prague 2025 at the latest.

Under SH6 conditions, you will get a total of 60 months (an additional 24 months). So, starting in Copenhagen 2022 means to finish before Copenhagen 2027 = Berlin 2027 at the latest.

- Do you already know the race dates for 2024, including Berlin?

Yes, here are the confirmed dates:

2024 races	race date	day
Lisbon	17.3.2024	Sun
Prague	6.4.2024	Sat
Berlin	7.4.2024	Sun
Copenhagen	15.9.2024	Sun
Cardiff	6.10.2024	Sun
Valencia	27.10.2024	Sun

Please note that the date of the Lisbon race had to be changed due to the extraordinary legislative elections in Portugal on March 10, 2024. The new date is March 17.

- The basic facts about the half marathon in Berlin.

- Are the Prague and Berlin races held on the same weekend?

Yes, both are held the first weekend in April, Prague on Saturday and Berlin on Sunday. Each race keeps its traditional date and that's great. There is no need to do them both on the same weekend; you have a 60-month time window to do them all.

- I ran the Berlin Half Marathon in 2023 or 2022 or earlier. Can I claim the result (from the past) and will it count for SuperHalfs?

Berlin Half Marathon will be part of the SuperHalfs series from 2024, so you can't claim the past results (2023 and older).

- Can I already register for the Berlin Half Marathon in 2024?

Yes, you can, registration is open and there are still entries available.

Don't forget to enter your SuperPassport number during registration.

- I am already registered for the Berlin Half Marathon in 2024 – how do I add my SuperHalfs passport number to my race registration?

Go back to your registration (https://login.scc-events.com/s/login/?language=en_US) and look for additional SuperHalfs product under the half marathon.

If you don't enter your number in the registration, don't worry, you can report your race result even after the race and it will be included in your SuperHalfs running journey.

- Can I use my SuperVoucher code for Berlin?

No, you have purchased a SuperVoucher with 5 races, so you can use it under current conditions, for all races except Berlin.

- Will you offer a new SuperVoucher for 6 races?

There will be a new voucher offer for the new year which allows you to secure entry across the series, but it will be linked to our charity programme and charitable fundraising.

More information will be released at the start of January 2024.
